
# Quick Reference Guide for Youth Offending Services Worker

Before your visit, please contact the facility / household to confirm if anyone has COVID-19 symptoms or is extremely vulnerable to COVID-19.

### Please remember - when interacting with people always...



Wash hands frequently (for at least 20 seconds) or use hand sanitizer with a minimum of 60% alcohol



Clean surfaces frequently including door handles, rails, hoists etc.



Avoid touching your face, nose and eyes



PPE is only needed if you are not able to maintain social distancing (2 metres away) or if a person you are working with is in the extremely vulnerable group being shielded.





## When do you need PPE?

If the YOS worker will be in direct contact with (e.g. touching) any member of a facility/setting (for example in a household or police cells) where any member is showing symptoms of COVID-19 or is unable to make an assessment of COVID-19 status and unable to maintain 2 metres social distance

#### or

If the YOS worker is visiting any household where any member of the household is in the extremely vulnerable group advised to shield\*

## What PPE should you use?

- Water repellent apron
- Disposable gloves
- Fluid repellent surgical mask\* (simple surgical mask for visits to shielded individuals)
- Eye protection (use if there is a risk of splashing/spitting)

\*Use one mask for each specific setting BUT change the mask for a new one every 8 hours, or sooner if it becomes moist or damaged during use. The mask should be replaced if removed for any reason. This includes after breaks for eating or drinking. A new mask should be used if any person you are working with is in the shielded group.

## Safe use and disposal of PPE

- Follow the guidance on how to safely put on/ take off PPE
- Only use aprons and gloves once for each client
- Use one mask (and eye protection, if required) for each session
- Decontaminate eye protection after use – if cleaned properly, it can be safely reused in a different setting
- Double bag aprons, gloves and mask upon disposal
- Separate from other waste, set aside and wait 72 hours before disposal in general waste
